WHAT ABOUT THE ROADS? The roads in our neighborhood need work. There's no denying that. Will the Livingston County Road Commission do the work and pay for it? NO! The county assumes no responsibility for repaving subdivision roads.

Genoa Township will subsidize repaving our roads, (pay a percentage), if a neighborhood volunteer coordinates the project. That means, getting bids from at least three contractors, presenting the information to the Genoa Township Board and finally, petitioning neighbors to determine interest once a per home cost is determined. However, the Genoa Township subsidy has limited funds and will likely be discontinued after the 2001 budget year. If we want to take advantage of this, we need to act NOW!

to help please call Cristy - Thanks Cristy for coordinating this great neighborhood




